### Papers

The Spanish Conference on Software Engineering and Databases, JISBD'2006, invites original, high quality papers reporting research results and/or experience related to the Software Engineering and Database areas. The Program Committee will evaluate each contributed paper based on its relevance, clarity, originality and suitability for JISBD'2006. The existence of validation results and/or experiences supporting the contribution will be also considered.

The major topics of interest related to the Software Engineering and Databases areas include, but are not limited to:

- Process engineering
- Aspect oriented software development
- Software architectures

- Software product lines
- Quality, measurement and estimation of products and processes
- Formal methods applied to Software Engineering
- Automatic code generation
- Component Based Software Engineering
- Model Engineering
- Maintenance, testing, verification and validation
- Web Engineering
- DBMS Technology (query optimization, transactions, security, views, etc.)
- Data Modelling (conceptual and/or logic)
- Software evolution and change
- Enterprise case studies
- Deductive DB, Active DB, Object and Object-Relational DB, Mobile DB, Spatial and Temporal DB
- Data Mining, Data Streaming and Datawarehouse
- Federated Information Systems
- Documental and Multimedia DB. Information recovery, indexing and DB on the Web
- XML and semi-structured data. Semantic Web. Ontologies

#### Paper submission:

Contributions to JISBD'2006 may be written in either Spanish, Portuguese or English. The paper must not be longer than 10 pages, including references. Submission details, including the abstract and full paper formats, as well as the electronic address for sending papers will be available at the JISBD'2006 web site from March 1, 2006. It must also include an abstract (200-250 words) and a set of keywords in line with the main topics of JISBD'2006. Papers arriving late or clearly longer than the limit will be immediately rejected solely for this reason by the Program Committee. Papers are to be submitted electronically by **May 25, 2006**.

- Estimated length in days (minimum: half day, maximum: two days)
- The desired, minimum and maximum number of workshop participants. Explain why this workshop should attract sufficient participants.
- Requested Audio/Video equipment, room capacity and organization, and materials
